Belém, the capital of the state of Pará, is a vibrant and historic city located in northern Brazil. Known as the "City of Mango Trees" due to the large number of these trees lining its streets, Belém stands out for its strong cultural, gastronomic, and architectural influences. With a hot and humid climate typical of the Amazon, the city is home to iconic landmarks such as the Ver-o-Peso Market, one of the largest open-air markets in Latin America, and the Círio de Nazaré, one of the world's largest religious celebrations. Its unique cuisine, based on Amazonian ingredients like tucupi, açaí, and jambu, is a highlight, making Belém a fascinating destination for those looking to explore the richness of Amazonian culture.
